

General Membership Meeting Location Change



General Membership Meeting - Saturday, February 11th, 2006

Call to order by the President (Wilbur [KH7E]) at 2P

In attendance were 23 members and 5 guests.

The sign-in sheet is attached to, and made a part of these minutes.

Those present introduced themselves.

A special announcement was made giving information as to the change of location for BIARC meetings for the next several months. The next meeting (March 11th) will NOT be held at the usual meeting facility. The upcoming meeting will be at the Puna Congregational Christian Church. It is located on Old Volcano Road, about 1/4 mile from where we usually meet. To find it, go past McDonalds (like you're going to the Kea'au Community Center) but don't turn left at the police station. Continue straight ahead and on the left is the Puna Congregational Christian Church (clearly identified with a large sign). We will meet behind the church building in the open pavilion. Get to know the location because this is where our regular Saturday meetings will be held until (and including) August 2006. We've not been evicted from Kea'au Community Center, just that the building will be undergoing extensive renovations. Aside from the new meeting location for these six months, during May we will have a get-together on Coconut Island. Then in September, BIARC will meet at Wailoa State Park. And in October it's off to Waimea for the Ham Fest.

Solomon [NH7ZE] mentioned that there will be a "young" hams" meeting after the regular meeting.

Bob [AH6J] reported that the Hospital Net will convene the first Saturday of each month. On March 4th a group of hams from O'ahu will come and set-up equipment at Hilo Medical Center. A discussion was held about the operation of the hospital equipment, and how could BIARC members be affiliated.

Ron [AH6HN] stated that on Friday, March 3rd at 1:30P there will be a test session in the electrical lab at Hawai'i Community College.

Mike [NH7JT] mentioned that a few weeks ago he had as a house guest, Jacqui Christian. She and her husband were visiting from Australia, and on their way to England. Jacqui has been a ham for a considerable time, first becoming licensed when she was growing up on Pitcairn Island. And most of her family, relatives and neighbors (on Pitcairn) are also amateurs.

Today's program was presented by Bob [AH6J] and Ron [AH6HN]. The topic was

repeaters, and they gave not only an overview of what they're all about, but also the details of how they operate, what is the sequence of operation when a repeater is keyed, and assorted other facts.

Then on to the business meeting-

Ron [AH6HN] indicated that the emergency net (controlled) will be active beginning on March 11th. And operating every two weeks from then at 7P (local) on 146.76 MHz.

It was indicated that the Secretary's report was printed in the newsletter.

The Treasurer reported that the treasury has a balance (subject to the usual audit, and not including funds received at this meeting) of \$1880.44. And the membership count is 62. Also, the Bill [NH7RQ- sk) Parry Memorial Fund had a balance of \$90, which was increased to \$100 most recently. Those wishing to contribute in memory of Bill can do so by sending a donation to the club. Please identify that the funds be designated for this fund.

Whereas Bob [AH6J] had to resign his position of Treasurer, and in compliance with BIARC by-laws, nominations from the floor were entertained for selection of a replacement. It was presented by Dave [KH7SO] that Ed [NH6HT] H. Breen's name be placed in nomination for the position of Treasurer for the term that expires on December 31st of 2006. The motion was seconded by Barbara [NH7FY]. There being no other nominations, the selection process was closed. The members in attendance then voted, by show of hands, and unanimously approved the election of Ed H. Breen to the position of Treasurer of the Big Island Amateur Radio Club for the period of February 11, 2006 to December 31, 2006. President Wilbur [KH7E] then performed the act of swearing in Ed.

There being no other business, new or otherwise, the president closed the meeting at 3:45P
