


Hilo Hospital gets new "Fly-Away-Radio Kit"

Extra parts etc. are also available in the "Bucket" which was provided by BIARC through a Project Impact grant from FEMA. (The bucket is not shown.)

As a long-time participant in operating emergency drills from the Hilo Medical Center. I would like to thank all the hospital staff there for their sincere courtesy and help, especially John Halloran, the Infection Control Officer; and also, Ross Nonaka, Supervisor of the Biomedical Engineering Department and his staff personnel. Our on site roof top antennas feed down to the biomedical lab location. History of the antennas is that they were built and installed by Harry Nishiyama, KH6FKG. The VHF is a 2 meter "J" pole. It worked great. No problems with the new Icom 706 on vhf. The HF antenna is a classic 80/40 meter trap which will work also on 20, 15 and 10 meters. We have been able to work 15 meters and get good signal reports from the mainland. At the time of the new Icom 706 test on HF, we had an "S-7" noise level. We were unable too hear the HF net on 7088, or 3888 khz. We then moved our operation outside of the building near the emergency room entrance. The "Buddy Pole" antenna was set up, and the noise was just as bad or worse. Most of the Hilo historic downtown area has at least a "S-5" noise level problem.

For several years, I have been bringing my own personal transceiver to put the hospital on the air. The new Icom 706 with automatic antenna tuner and power supply is a wonderful addition. I think that as time progresses we will have a station that will provide much satisfaction for us operators, and the need for portability a real life saver. I will have a full report on the operation of this setup in a quiet noise location by our next BIARC meeting, and we will have a show and tell with this rig.

The KRN club started several months ago making electronic projects. Our first project was a light-emitting-diode code practice keyer. It worked on a 9v battery, had a resister, diode, key (a push button switch), and the light emitting diode that turns on when the key is depressed. Our next project will be a real audio code-practice oscillator. It will be transistorized and slightly more complicated than our first project.

We would appreciate donations of parts that will go towards future projects. For this next project, we will need: (4) 9v batteries; (4) battery clips; (12) 0.022 microfarad ceremic capicators; (4) 2N366 transistors; (4) 5.6 kilo-ohm resistors; (4) 10 kilo-ohm resistors; (4) 2 mega-ohm potentiometers; (4) earphones (1k-2k magnetic type).

Of course, any parts would be appreciated and used for future projects.
