Big Island Amateur Radio Club General Meeting May 10, 2008

Meeting was opened at 2:05PM by President Fred KH7Y. Sign in sheet was passed around and attached to these minutes.

Introductions were made by those present. Fred announced that it is Armed Forces Day. A moment of silence was held for Jack Wheeler KH6CC who died on April 9th. Barbara announced that Mayor Kim will not be able to attend Field Day but is sending Quince Mento in his place. She also showed the Proclamation from the mayor proclaiming the week of Field Day Amateur Radio Week in Hawaii.

Fred introduced Quince Mento and Bill Hanson of Civil Defense. They each told about themselves and what they hope to accomplish at Civil Defense. They have invited the club to come to the Operations Center to see the setup there. The date of July 12th has been selected for this meeting at 2PM. Both Quince and Bill answered questions from the audience.

Refreshments and Social time followed the program.

Business Meeting started at 3PM.

Secretary's report was approved as printed in the newsletter.

Ron AH6HN was not available to give a treasurer's report. It was reported that we have 99 members at this time. We received an application from Teddi Stransky KH6TS which brought the total to 100.

Bob AH6J reported on the repeater status. He reported that Helco is now out of the building at Kulani and that he has purchased a new combination lock to be put on the building. He hasn't heard anything from Dennis KH7H about Mauna Kea. Rick WH6FC reported that the machine at South Point was switched off again and the link was down. Apparently turning it back on again with the control codes is solving the problem. Paul WH7BR is in a

position to send the control codes and can see whether it is functioning or not, so he's going to do it periodically to make sure it stays on. Rick wanted to remind the club to send a letter to the Pacific Radio Group in regards to South Point site use. Bob will follow up but he is sure that the letter has been sent.

Barbara reported on the status of the QSL Bureau. During the month of April there were 1195 cards received. (The original 6000 cards received in March have all been sent out) There have been 17 envelopes containing 60 cards returned as undeliverable and these cards will be returned to ARRL. As of April 30th we have 32 hams who do not want bureau cards. These cards will also be returned to ARRL. The undeliverable and no bureau cards will be stamped as such and returned to ARRL who in turn will return them to the originators. The first expense report sent to ARRL was a big one...\$446.58 which included \$220.69 for postage and stamps, \$41.67 for printing of letter, \$87.50 for 5 rubber stamps, \$81.72 for Office Max supplies and \$15.00 for checks. There are 94 hams at this time with envelopes/credits on hand. Funds in the donation account are being used to pay for insufficient postage on some envelopes. Ned KH7JJ on Oahu has been advised to send the remaining cards for the mainland back with Chuck AH6SC next week. Barbara will see about mailing them out from here. Barbara reported that she has received some interesting messages from hams and all are very appreciative of our taking over the bureau. She read one letter from Bud Skoien AH6NZ who lives in Tampa, Florida.

Health and Welfare: Barbara has sent sympathy cards to the Haruwo Yamamoto and Jack Wheeler families and to Chuck Cartwright on the death of his wife Nora. Thinking of You card was sent to Harry Barnes KH6QM and a note to Gloria Whiteley on her recent illness.

Curt AH6RE reported that everything is okay with the newsletter. He needs articles in by 20th of each month. It was noted that he had received an E Mail from Mel Kernahan, an associate member from California, praising him on how excellent the last newsletter was.

Old Business:

The KH6IAA tower is not down yet. Fred KH7Y is hoping to get a crew together to get it taken care of.

Paul WH7BR had presented an agenda to the Board and briefly went over it for the General meeting. Food during the day will be each persons responsibility but there will be a steak dinner in the evening. As incentives to get hams to operate Fred KH7Y and Paul WH7BR are offering a free dinner to anyone who makes at least 25 contacts or makes contacts overnight between the hours of 10PM and 6AM. Otherwise there will be a charge of \$5 for the dinner.

New Business:

Annual Report to ARRL- Fred wanted to know who updated the report and when was it last done. Bob AH6J reported that Ron had been doing it. Bob will check to see when it was done last.

Club Assets- Inventory must be completed. Wilbur says he has a list. Fred will work with him to get it done. Paul WH7BR has offered to help. Bob AH6J has a list of the repeater equipment. Rick WH6FC will make a list of materials at South Point.

Club Activities- Fred asked what activities the club is interested in doing. These items were mentioned: Emergency Communications, Annual Tsunami Drill on May 24th, being involved in emergency training and SET in October.

Please keep 14.270, 7.050, and 7.060 clear for the emergency in China. I realize propagation may not allow direct communications, however you might interfere with a station that can work them. Thanks, Kevin, AH6QO, ARRL Pacific SEC.

It appears that hams are very active in parts of the Chinese earthquake zone. While little can be done from the USA due to propagation being poor, we all can help by NOT adding to the clutter. Field Day 2008

Mark your calendars, this year's ARRL Field Day will be held the weekend of June 28 and 29. Operations will start at 0800 HST Saturday, and run until 0800 HST Sunday. Club members should plan to stop by the BIARC setup to visit and operate. Visitors will also be welcome at the Field Day operations of the other Big Island clubs.

BIARC Field Day 2008 will be held at Wailoa Park in Hilo, in the area between the Wailoa Center and Waiakea Pond. This is at the end of Piopio Street and is between the State building and the Kamehameha statue. Piopio Street runs east from Pauahi Street, which is accessible from either Kamehameha Avenue or Kilauea Avenue in Hilo. Talk-in will be available on the club repeater at 146.76 MHz. Information is available from Paul Ducasse WH7BR.

Setup will begin early Saturday morning.

This year's operation will be in class 1A using the club call KH6EJ. We plan to operate all HF bands between 80 and 10 meters, using both phone and CW, depending on propagation. Lloyd Cabral KH6LC has arranged for his crane truck to be available to hold one HF yagi and to support antennas for 40 and 80 meters. The main station will be an FT-1000D running 150 watts. There will be a TS-480SAT Get On The Air station for casual operation by visitors. We will interface the radios to computers to partially automate the logging.

Power will be provided by generators loaned by Paul WH7BR and Fred KH7Y. We will also operate on solar power for some time and maybe even a fuel cell for advanced power technology credit.

There will be a VHF/UHF satellite operation organized by Fred KH7Y.

Since there are many nearby places to get food, the club will not be providing breakfast and lunch as in previous years. However, there will be a steak dinner Saturday night. A dinner ticket will be \$5.00. Paul WH7BR and Fred KH7Y are sponsoring a free steak dinner challenge for anyone who operates during the day and makes more than 25 contacts, or anyone who operates overnight between 10 PM and 6 AM Sunday. Get in touch with Fred to reserve a steak.

There will be a VE licensing exam session at the Wailoa Center on Saturday morning at about 10:30. If you plan to attend the license exam, please contact Ron Phillips in advance.

The **South Point Amateur Radio Club** will have its Field Day activity at Whittington Park AKA Honuapo near Na'alehu. This will be their third year at the Honuapo location. For those equipped with GPS, steer for Latitude N19.086 and longitude W155.550. The navigationally challenged can get talked in on 146.520.

The club will use call sign KH6EL in class 1A with generator power. Setup will begin at 0800 HST on June 28. There will be a VE exam session at 1300 HST on June 28. For more information, contact WH6FC.

Dean KH7B says that the Hilo ARC / Big Island QRP Club will probably not participate in Field Day this year.

No information has been received from other Big Island clubs.
